



Dear Friends;

I am licensed social workers who, along with some other people, try to assist others overseas who are in need of assistance. As I saw a need for more assistance than we could provide ourselves I started providing information about the assistance that organizations in the United States, Great Britain, and Australia could provide. My hope is that you can network with these other organizations to meet your needs. I am enclosing a long list of websites that may help you access assistance.

I have provided more information than you probably need; however, since you are the only person from Haiti that I have contact with, at this time, I am hoping you can distribute the information to those that can use it.

For Funding:

Foundation grants can be a great way to obtain funding. If you do not have enough experience with writing successful grant proposals I strongly urge you to enlist a consultant from: **www.idealists.org** . Near the top of their home page they list a link to a Directory of Consultants. Please click onto this link where you can enlist the help of a person to write a letter of inquiry after which you may be invited to submit a grant proposal. **The consultant should know which foundations will most likely provide the funding you seek.** They may charge a 5-10 % fee when a proposal is successful which, I believe, could be included in a proposal. No fee should be collected for unsuccessful proposals. You should probably send each potential funding source a letter of inquiry first. They would then invite you to submit a full proposal. You can find the requirements for a letter of inquiry/proposal on most websites for foundations. <http://fdncenter.org/grantmaker> is the website for **The Foundation Center** where you should be able to find out the cost of their catalog entitled, “**Grants for International and Foreign Programs**”. When I obtained my copy in 1987 it only cost \$30. I have heard that it now costs about \$125. However, I would check it out to be sure of the cost. If you can afford it this catalog will be very helpful with locating foundations that can assist your work. **The Foundation Center** also has a short course on grantwriting if you are interested on their website. The **Loyola Foundation** is one of the few foundations that accepts grant proposals for building projects. They are primarily interested in non-recurring requests for capital improvements in the missionary area, which are self-sustaining after completion, special consideration given to requests where there are matching contributions from the missionary area itself. Their geographical focus is Latin America. They do have an application form that is required. You can send an initial inquiry letter and ask for their application form and grant guidelines to this address:
